

The Women of "32 Bright Clouds"

"32 Bright Clouds: Beethoven Conversations Around the World" is a global music-commissioning, performing and recording project curated by pianist Yael Weiss. The project commissions a diverse group of composers from countries of conflict and unrest around the world, with all new works unified by a single "Peace motif" from Beethoven, above which he added the inscription "A Call for Inward and Outward Peace" in the manuscript. Each new composition is connected to one of Beethoven's Piano Sonatas. "32 Bright Clouds" aims to harness music's great power for unity and peace.

The following programs highlight the unique voices of women composers from Latin America, the Middle East, and beyond, in response to Beethoven's peace motif.

Program I Peace works from Latin America

Wilma Alba Cal (Cuba, b. 1988): Hand in Hand Sonata (2023) World Premiere (In response to the Sonata No. 28. Dedicated to the memory of Ernesto Lecuona, who through his work manifested the creative power of the independent artist to free our minds and be who we are)

Carolina Noguera-Palau (Colombia, b. 1978): De Adoración y Espanto (Of Adoration and Fear) (2020)

(In response to the Sonata No. 31. Dedicated to the hundreds of community leaders in Colombia, who are being subjected to widespread and systematic intimidation and assassination)

(In response to the Sonata No. 26. Après... is written after Beethoven's Les Adieux Sonata. It borrows its essential musical ideas from the sonata, and the desire for a peaceful and united world from the beautiful mind and soul of its creator.)
